## **Dear Parents/Guardians:**

The staff and members of the Wisconsin American Legion Auxiliary Badger Girls State Committee are looking forward to having your daughter participate in this 68th session of Badger Girls State. You can be proud of her for being selected by her school and the local American Legion Auxiliary to attend Badger Girls State. Thank you for permitting her to do this!

I highly recommend that you also accompany your daughter to a Badger Girls State Orientation scheduled in your area. A list of scheduled orientations in the state and Badger Girls State Session Information can be viewed on the [www.badgergirlsstate.org](http://www.badgergirlsstate.org) website. You are welcome to attend any one of the Orientations scheduled throughout the state.

If there is a questionable health condition such as recent exposure to communicable disease, disability, temporary handicap or special diet, these must be discussed with the Executive Director Delores Woolf prior to registration.

## **Medical Form:**

The medical form is on our website. Be sure to have the completed form ready to turn in during registration on Sunday, June 19. Your daughter **will not** be allowed to register at Badger Girls State Session without the completed and signed Medical forms.

Failure to have all information on the card will necessitate a call home for missing information. It would be advisable to make a copy of the health form in case such call has to be made to your home.

If your daughter is taking a prescription drug, place any prescription drugs or medications in a zip lock bag identified with her name. Bring only the amount she'll need for the amount of days attending BGS session. They are to be in the original container, the name of the medication, the dosage, the frequency of administration and the route of administration should be indicated on the label. The label should also have the name of the prescribing physician, the prescription number; date prescribed, possible adverse reaction, the specific conditions when contact should be made with the physician and other special instructions as needed. All medications brought by a citizen who is under 18 years of age shall be kept in a locked unit and shall be administered by one of our Nursing staff. A citizen may carry bee sting medications, inhalers, an insulin syringe or other medication or device used in the event of life threatening situations. Any deviation from this will be up to the Head Nurse.

You and your family are cordially invited to attend the following:

- Opening Convocation at 1:30 p.m. on Sunday, June 19
- Inauguration of the BGS Constitutional Officers and Legislators at 7:00 p.m. Thursday, June 23, (due to lack of space family/guest will not be allowed at the dinner.)
- Final assembly at 10:45 a.m. Friday, June 24.

These will all be held in the Kolf Center on the UW-Oshkosh campus.
